Nepal Chitwan-Region



Improves the living conditions of approx. 39,038 people



For a hygiene workshop in a village community we are investing €150



Viva con Agua is collecting 242,313 in 2018 for Nepal



The project has a term of 6 years and ends in 2020



- 1) Strengthen community institutions in the field of water and sanitation management
- 2) Improve access to safe and clean drinking water
- 3) Improve of health and hygiene conditions



One focus of the project in Chitwan is on the schools of the project area. Many children need to travel a long way to school each day, making it all the more important that schools can guarantee clean drinking water and access to toilets. In addition, hygiene education makes sense, above all in schools, as children learn and implement new hygiene behaviors the fastest.

Nepal Chitwan-Region

- The total cost of the project is € 894,000 and will be fully covered by Viva con Agua
- Until 2020 there are still € 308,398 to pay

The rural region of Chitwan District is located southwest of the capital of Nepal, Kathmandu. The majority of the Nepalese population has secure access to drinking water. However, access to basic sanitation remains a major challenge.

After a devastating earthquake hit large parts of the Himalayan state in the spring of 2015, Nepal was thrown into the global limelight. Disaster relief is not part of the work of Viva con Agua. But the commitment to sustainably improve of the WASH situation in rural project areas of Nepal will be enhanced with the project in Chitwan.

The percentage of inhabitants in the country without access to clean drinking water is 12% (3,480,000 people) and without access to basic sanitation 54% (15,660,00 people).
